## Providing Services

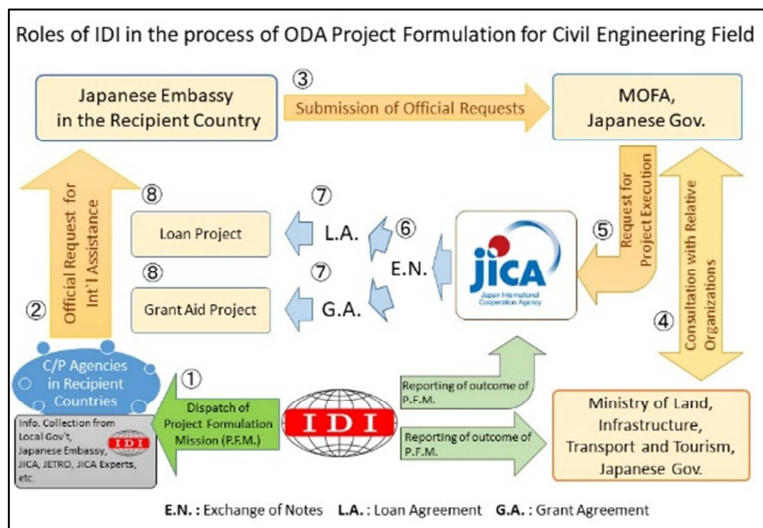
IDI's purpose is contribute to international social development and to better, sustainable living conditions for people all over the world by participating in projects that promote international mutual understanding in the construction industry and contribute to economic and technical progress in developing countries, particularly with cooperation for the development, operation and maintenance of infrastructure. IDI was established in 1956, as a corporation under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Construction (currently Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport, and Tourism (MLIT)).

IDI carries out its corporate mission through the following activities.

- ◆ Promoting international mutual understanding in the construction industry
- ◆ Conducting research and training programs on overseas infrastructure development, operation and maintenance, and dispatching study teams.
- ◆ Providing consulting services in the construction sector worldwide.
- ◆ Collecting and compiling information and reference materials, etc. on infrastructure in Japan and overseas for exchanges and distribution.

## Project Achievement/Technical Expertise

- ◆ IDI supports IDI members in their efforts to conduct research needed to discover and formulate infrastructure projects in developing countries. IDI also engages in research to collect and deliver information on infrastructure development all over the world.
- ◆ In response to official requests from developing countries, IDI dispatches study teams to facilitate formulation of infrastructure development projects by collecting information, conducting studies, and consulting with local governments. Thereafter, we continuously promote the realization of projects by reporting the results of our studies to JICA and/or MLIT.
- ◆ IDI serves as the secretariat for the IFNet, International Flood Network, which is a natural disaster mitigation program. It receives cooperation from many countries aiming to promote activities that will contribute to reducing the negative impacts of floods all over the world. IDI also manages and operates the Global Flood Alert System (GFAS), which uses global rainfall data gathered by satellites to provide displays of global flood risk maps with color coding based on rainfall probability.
- ◆ IDI provides technical support to officials and engineers in governmental organizations in developing countries through training and other programs provided by JICA and other organizations.
- ◆ IDI conducts research and investigations of overseas infrastructure development work undertaken under contracts with MLIT and other organizations.
